White to move and win

1. e4!! fxe4

Or 1. ... dxe4 2. Ke3 Kf7 3. d5 exd5 4. h5 Ke6 5. h6.

2. Ke3 Kf7 3. Kf4 Kg6 4. Kxg4 b6 5.

Kxg3 Kh5 6. Kh3 Kg6 7. g4 Kh6 8. g5+ Kh5 9. Kg3 Kg6 10. Kg4 Kh7 11. h5 Kg7 12. g6 Kh6 13. Kh4 Kg7 14. Kg5! e3 15. h6+ Kg8 16. Kf6 e2 17. h7+ wins.

This could be repaired by taking away the ... b7-b6 tempo. But in that case, why all those queenside pawns? We can remove the a3, b2, b5, and b7 pawns. If White's king goes around the queenside for the e6-pawn, the Black king meanwhile breaks into the kingside to secure the draw. In short, the study needs work.

On the other hand, we have many nice, similar breakthroughs in chess literature. Is it worth while to do all the required work on this position in order to add another?


So far, our samples of pawn endings are relatively easy. Next time we will examine more difficult endings, where even grandmasters have gone wrong.

2. Rules changes to the CJA contest

a. a motion was passed to open all appropriate categories to online publishing. John Hillery's comment in the CJ that online works could be edited and changed which hard copies could not was noted. Thus online entrants will be required to date and send a copy of possible entrants to either the president or the webmaster. There will be 3 special

online categories: column. tournament report, photo; all other online work will mix in with the others, e.g., opening analysis, editorial. etc.

b. a motion was passed concerning eligibility criteria: In order to qualify for CJA awards, you must be an American resident or be published in the American print medium(mag. or newspaper). Thus, an American resident featured in a foreign based web site is eligible, but a foreign national on the same site is

c. a motion was passed reinstating the practice of selecting the Journalist of the Year award through voting by the membership with nominations being put out in the Chess Journalist.

d. a motion was passed establishing a \$50/year patron category. Whoever pays \$50 will be listed as a patron of the CJA in each issue of that year in the Chess Journalist.
